President's Report

First Anniversary

November 24, 2005, will mark the first anniversary of the ownership of the former Arcanum Wayne Trail Grange building. A casual glance of the building would indicate not much has changed, and this is as it should be.

However, almost every day, incremental changes are happening. One of our first goals was to stop the deterioration of the building and porch being caused by leaking roofs. We now have a dry building and porch, with a restored porch foundation and a solid floor. We still need to install a ceiling, lighting, decorative trim and a downspout, none of which affect the integrity of the porch.

Our second major goal is to make the building more energy efficient. To that end, we are in the process of finishing and installing 23 new Marvin windows. (We still have six more to fund@ \$500). Also, before we can insulate the attic, new electrical service needs to be installed on the second floor. That is now "roughed in" thereby permitting the insulation process, once the weather cools down.

Elsewhere in this newsletter is a breakdown of the income and expenses since May 22, 2004. Because of the significant capital improvement projects as discussed above, we have a negative cash flow, resulting in the need to borrow \$8,000. In order to pay for these essential projects, we may have to borrow and additional \$8,000-\$9,000, depending on our fund raising efforts as well as donations.

The Board has decided that no further major projects will be implemented until this debt is reduced. This will include furnace replacement, new electrical service for the first floor, new ceilings, tuck pointing, replacing bricks and etc. unless volunteer labor and donations are specifically receive for such projects.

Our second annual meeting is scheduled for January 12, 2006 at 7:00 p.m. Since we will not have another general mailing before that time, and

One of the many committees of the AWfHS is the design committee.

We have met many times in the past nine months. Our focus is to plan and coordinate each of the rooms . The purpose is to best suit the needs of the historical memorabilia of Arcanum and the surrounding communities. Our focus at this time is to refurbish the main floor, making ready for displays and the community education and enjoyment, but all the rooms on both floors have been given a purpose and name assignment. FIRST FLOOR

Room #1 (entering from the front porch) Parlordisplay period furniture, piano and other displays. <u>Room#2</u> Museum shop, display cases, book shelves, and other artifacts.

Room#3 Functioning kitchen and display area Room#4 Back room, Period dining room and display area, and genealogy area. Room#5 Community Meeting Room, display cases, photos, etc. SECOND FLOOR At this time and because of state fire codes, we cannot legally use this space as a museum, but will use the area for display storage (that can be rotated to the first floor for community appreciation) and much needed office space. Room #2 and #3 The smallest of all rooms will be the society office space, desk, file cabinets, computer, printer, etc. Room#4 Ancestors Room - articles of early education, religion, period clothing, tools, weapons, etc. Room#5 Reading Room - bookcases, table and chairs, periodicals.

Room#6 Arcanum, Yesterday and Today celebration, sports, school, and recreation.


Room#7 Arcanum Stories - newspaper, railroad, post office, library, clubs, fire department, and water / electricity. Room#8 Pioneers and Businesses

Members of the design committee are Jo Dunlap, Joan Rench. Cheryl and Dick Hunt, Barb Deis, Rose Lambert, Carolyn Troutwine, Carolyn Furlong, and a special thank you to Ken Blackburn for his drawings and building specs.

The remodeling is on going, but soon we will be displaying items and invite the public to donate or loan to the society items and memorabilia from the surrounding area such as Victorian parlor and dining room furniture, and any period clothing and dress forms, china, desks, file cabinets, bookshelves, computer, printer, school and business artifacts, sports memorabilia, display cases, art work, linens, or any history of the area you think may be of interest to the historical society. Historic Site Restoration

Arcanum Wayne Trail Historical Society has designated its first Historic Site - the gravesite of Arcanum's founder, William Gunder and his wife Nancy Rice Gunder, located in the Ithaca Cemetery. The monuments were placed there in 1849 when Nancy died and need new foundations to preserve them for the future.

The restoration work of these historic markers is contracted to Monumental Engravers located on U.S. Rt. 127 just north of the Arcanum-Butler Middle School. Owner Stan Hanzel plans to complete the project by late September or early October. Monument Engravers business sells monuments, bronze plaques, and performs cemetery lettering in western Ohio and eastern Indiana. The cost of the renovation is covered by a gift to Arcanum Wayne Trail Historical *Society* by William and Carolyn Gunder together with their daughter, Tamala Marley. William is the great-grandson of Arcanum's founder.


Summer Event

Wayne Trail Grange No. 2647 Sharing Its History

Since 1894, many businesses and organizations have served the community from the two-story brick structure at 123 W. George Street, now the home of the Arcanum Wayne Trail Historical Society.Built as a saloon, it was used through the years as a moving picture theatre, farm implement dealership, soda pop bottling plant, music store, hotel, rooming house and others.

None served the community with greater dedication and enthusiasm then the owners between 1963 and 2004, the Wayne Trail Grange Chapter No. 2647.

Organized Sept. 14, 1936, with 48 charter members, Wayne Trial Grange had grown to 124 members when they purchased the Beck Hotel for their active group. The first meeting held in 1936 took place at West Point School, west of Arcanum. They continued to meet there until Feb. 3, 1937 when they moved to the second floor of the Junior Order building, 104-107 North High Street. By 1940, 64 families were represented, with the membership reaching 150.

The heritage of the Grange, founded in 1867, was based in agriculture. The purpose was to "Educate and Elevate the American Farmer". The Grange, state and national levels, was instrumental in a long list of legislation to help rural America: vocational agriculture in schools, Agricultural Extension Service, Rural Electrification Administration and rural mail delivery along with many others.

There was also strong emphasis on community service. Grange No.2647 took part in county fair Grange booths and food tents, gave holiday baskets to needy families, sponsored a softball team, gave financial support to ill members, exchange students and families in need, and held blood drives. They contributed to many community and county projects. The large shelter in Ivester Park was paid for and built by Grange members.

To fund these projects, members sold cookbooks, dish clothes, had farm sale lunch stands. They served banquets for local businesses and clubs, sometimes for as many as 125 people.

Over the years, the Grange honored many people for their outstanding service to the community. Annual appreciation dinners were held for the fire department and rescue squad.

During their 68-year history, Wayne Trail Grange members received many honors from the

Ohio State Grange. One year after organizing, Wayne Trail was given an Award of Merit for having the largest membership In Darke County. Several members received their Silver Star certificates in 1962. In 1971, Wayne Trail Grange won "Pride in Ohio", a statewide contest sponsored by the National Grange Mutual Insurance Co. Six charter members received Golden Sheaf Certificates in 1986. Members won many awards in county wide Grange contests.

In 1956, the Grange purchased a lot on West George Street and started a building fund. When the Beck Hotel became available, members voted to purchase the hotel instead of constructing a new Grange. Papers were signed January 4, 1963, the first meeting was held in May 16th and October 13 the hall was dedicated.

Extensive remodeling was completed to serve the needs of the Grange. The roof was fixed. A new furnace and a water heater were installed. Removing interior partitions and a central wall, where a new floor was laid and the ceiling was lowered, made a large hall, on the east s de of the building.

The purchase of two stoves was necessary to serve large banquets. A serving area was made by opening the wall between the kitchen and second room on the west side of the building.

A wooden attached garage at the rear was removed to provide off street parking.

At one time, Ohio had more Grange Chapters then any other state. Darke County Grange Chapters were Anchor, Concord, Lightsville, Delisle, Wayne, Stelvideo, Gettysburg, Ansonia, Ithaca Twin, Brown Township, New Madison and New Weston. Two chapters are still active, Stelvideo No. 295 and Wayne No. 238.

Today, people of all ages throughout this area have fond memories of attending Grange activities and family parties held at Wayne Trail Grange. Many are grateful to the members for their tremendous service to our community. It is no secret, for 68 years Wayne Trail Grange No. 2647 was an important part of life in Arcanum.
