May 10th Membership Meeting Program 7:00 p.m. Speaker Susan Gray - Peace and Friendship Treaty 1814

Darke Countian and Native American Susan Gray has been appointed by Ohio Governor John Kasich to be Darke County's representative to provide information about the Bicentennial of the War of 1812. This pivotal yet all but forgotten War in our nation's history secured Ohio's northern boundaries and ended the conflict with Native American Tribes in this part of the United States.

Two men who were key players in the events leading to the signing of Treaty of Greene Ville in 1795, Tecumseh and William Henry Harrison, were prominent players in the War of 1812. Not many Darke Countians know of the significant event which took place July 22, 1814 in Greene Ville on the same spot on which the signing of the 1795 Treaty took place.

Join us May 10th at 7:00 p.m. to learn of events which occurred at the conclusion of the war and the treaty which ended the conflict between eight Native American tribes and the United States.

Many of you know Susan for her conservation leadership for which she has been recognized by President George Bush, President Bill Clinton and Governor Robert Taft.

Their son Larry Jr. lives in southern New Jersey with his wife Debbi and two daughters, Madison and Abby. Daughter Ann Forbes and her husband Scott live in Colerain, OH.

Remembering Betty Mehaffie Hissong Sutton

Our community lost a friend when Betty Sutton passed away this year. Born with congenital cataracts, surgery at age 7 corrected the sight in one eye allowing her to see for 40 years before going blind again. Surgery in the other eye gave her sight until she was 70. Her sight slowly faded away, leaving her blind until her death at age 91.

Betty shares her memories of living in Monroe and Arcanum through compositions in verse. Her writings are complied into three books all of which she wrote after losing her sight. Betty's books are available to read at the historical society and the Arcanum Public Library.

A determined Betty lead a very active life, wanting to be self reliant. She was valedictorian of her class at Monroe High School. Betty married Evert Hissong and they raised 3 daughters; Connie (Spahr), Peggy (Didier) and Kay (Roth). She was an inspiration to her daughters and her many friends. Betty kept a spotless home, sewed for her girls and wasn't afraid to try new things. After learning to play the guitar and sing, she enjoyed entertaining at activities. Writing was her passion which she started at the age of 6 and continued throughout her life. Having limited sight or being blind, Betty used new technology to help live independently for many years. Betty was a brave person, facing life challenges with God's graces.

Betty's father Silven Mehaffie was known as a whittler. At the age of 79 he carved a multi piece display which he named "Great Darke County Fair". It has a Ferris Wheel, Merry-Go-Round, & Corn Shucker, all with moving parts, and much more. This wonderful example of folk art is displayed on the second floor of the historical society and can be seen by contacting a broad member for an appointment.

Silven and his wife Iva (Weaver) also had a son Kenneth. Kenneth and his wife Pauline (Henninger) have two children, Sandra Sue and Darryl Mehaffie.

The machine for mixing the concrete for our street paving began work last Monday, a week ago on High Street. The work went along smoothly and except for a couple of days when the machine was out of commission, the whole force was busily working putting in the concrete. Up to this time they have work completed on High Street and about half of it on George Street. (Arcanum Times 07/11/1912)

Plans are to be made for a celebration to be held sometime after completion of the paved streets. The planning meeting will be held at the Opera House (Arcanum Times 08/08/1912)

DON'T FORGET THE DAY - TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 1912. The streets of Arcanum in the Business Section are paved. Celebration of the completion along with Booster Day will be held September 10th. (Arcanum Times 08/29/1912)

Editor's Note - Business Streets in 1912 were: George, Main, High, and South Sts.
