Keith and Carolyn Furlong did a great job scheduling workers for that event. I want to thank all members and friends of the historical society who helped make these projects successful.

The Checking/Savings balance as of August 31, 2012 was \$5,388.17. Total revenue for the first 8 months of this year was \$9,362.16. Total operating expenses for the same time period were \$3,848.20.

Improvements to our grounds this summer were laying the brick base for the black cast iron yard furniture. Bricks used were from original sidewalks in the village. The Storage Building got a fresh coat of stain.

We were pleased to have the Darke County Center of the Arts present one of the Coffee House performances here at AWTHS in September. The Russian Duo gave a spectacular performance for the 65 in attendance. Everyone enjoyed the Russian desserts and beverages. After deducting expenses from monies donated for refreshments we made \$65.75. Thanks to Rose Lambert of Rose Post for providing floral arrangements for the evening.

The Christmas Bazaar is in the planning stages. Sharon and Richard Troutwine will oversee set-up and pricing. Joan Rench and Barb Deis will co-chair responsibilities for the Bake Shoppe & County Store. The Little Boutique will be coordinated by Carolyn Furlong.

Our annual membership meeting will be January 10th. Elections of Officers will be held on this evening. Plan to attend this important meeting.

Also January 1st is when all membership fees are due. Your prompt payment is appreciated.

The 2012 membership dues brought in \$2,195.80. An additional \$505 was contributed at the time of membership payment. Your membership fees and contributions help us meet our operating expenses.

Preservation of Arcanum Times from 1899 Through 1971 Fred and Carolyn Troutwine 692-8939

Anita Short's family donated her collection of Arcanum times (1899-1971 to the Historical Society. We have agonized over how/what should be done to preserve one of the most valuable records of Arcanum's history. After months of fact finding, it has been decided by the Board to proceed forward with attempts to get Grant funding for the "save the newspapers" project.

It has been projected that we will need 12,000 plastic sleeves, materials for 60 binders, hand-held wand scanner, and a computer and printer compatible with the scanner.

The ultimate goal of this project is to make information available that otherwise would be lost to generations interested in the past history of Arcanum and surrounding areas. Once the newspapers are in plastic sleeves, readers will be able to obtain genealogical information, read social and random events of any particular year, and get a feeling of what life was really like through the years.

Twelve thousand plastic sleeves will need to be filled with pages of newspapers. As monies become available, supplies will be purchased. The first priority will be the sleeves and materials for the binders. Hopefully, we will have a designated area and time, when volunteers can come and place the papers in plastic sleeves. We think this will be a great "snowy day" project for the winter. The greater the number of people helping; the sooner the newspapers will be available for reading.

Southern Darke County History Annette Stewart 692-6462

As AWTHS continues to remember our men and women who have served in war times, we want to pass on this information about commemorating veterans of the Korean War.

On June 25, 2012, the Korean War Commemoration Committee launched "The Year of the Korean War Veteran." As part of the commemoration, the Department of Defense (DOD) will issue a certificate of appreciation to honor any Veteran who served in the U. S. Armed Forces from June 25, 1950 to July 27, 1953.

The military service did NOT have to be in Korea. To register for a certificate, please go to the Korean War 60th Anniversary website, i.e., http://www.Koreanwar.defense.gov, click on recognition request and complete the form. Or send the Veteran's name, branch of service and return mailing address to: Korean War 60th Anniversary Commemoration Committee, 2530 Crystal Drive, Suite 1400, Arlington, VA 22202.

To add to displays at AWTHS of the various wars and conflicts we appreciate donations of artifacts from the Korean War such as photos, letters, diaries, awards, uniforms, newspaper clippings, stories, and such. We are looking for items and information from the Southern Darke County area. We wish to honor all those who served during any war or conflict. If you would like, items may be on loan for exhibit purposes only.

Christmas In Arcanum

The year Santa first made an appearance in Arcanum is not clear. Although, The Smith Big Store had toy land on the second floor and Santa was there in the late 1800's. We know in 1906 Santa arrived in Arcanum by way of the traction line.

In more recent years Santa and Mrs. Claus arrived by horse drawn carriage, Karaoke wagon, fire truck and vintage cars just in time for the Holiday Parade on the Saturday following Thanksgiving. Santa arriving in town accompanied by bands, decorated floats, new cars, school buses, and fire trucks is a long standing tradition. There was a huge Christmas parade Dec. 11, 1940, which may have been the first Christmas parade in Arcanum.

Each year one boy and one girl is selected to ride in the parade with Santa and Mrs. Claus. They are given a gift provided by Alan and Judy Fourman. The children are chosen from letters sent to Santa.

Following the parade and visiting with the children Mr. and Mrs. Claus make their way back "up North" walking along Main Street. They love hearing the sound of car horns tooting and children cheering as the children are surprised to see Santa and his wife walking through town. If the cars stop for the children to get a better look, Santa gives them treats.

Alan Fourman started as Santa's special helper in 1995 then in 1998 Judy became Mrs. Claus' special helper. Since then these special helpers have been at Santa's house each Saturday in December to visit with the children.

Christmas for the children is a community effort. The Business Association provides film for the photographs and Santa's house which is located at George and Main Streets. Over the years different organizations have provided candy for the children, recently it has been the Business Association. Judy and Alan provide a gift for each child who can not have candy. The Band Boosters schedule students to take the photos. Judy makes sure the inside of Santa's house is decorated differently each year.

Santa's house and a huge donated evergreen are put in place at the corner of Main and George Sts. by city workers then lights & decorations are put on the tree. The year the first Community Christmas Tree went up was 1922 and has been a tradition except for war years and the depression years. The tree was set up in the intersection of George and High Sts. which was considered the center of the business district for many years. 1913 was the beginning of the wide use of Christmas lights.

Residents of all ages have enjoyed the Christmas trees put up by the Business Association and decorated by the businesses - it makes such a pretty site on George Street. The year merchants first put up individual trees was 1949.

December is a busy time for Alan and Judy. A special day for Judy is when she can wear the beautiful red dress and spend the day at the Cancer Treatment Center in Greenville. It is a treat for the patients to visit with Mrs. Claus who of course has a gift for each person, items she has collected throughout the year.

As our churches and organization have done since the 1800's they continue to help families in need especially at Christmas. Each year Judy and Alan select several of those families, along with the help of an anonymous family in town who provides food while Judy and Alan provide toys or/and clothes that are needed, which Santa himself delivers.

During the depression in 1932, 32 families were given Christmas baskets containing food for Christmas Day, clothes if needed and toys donated by Arcanum families and rehabilitated by the Sigerfoos American Legion Post. Christmas of 1941, at the beginning of WWII, the legion provided for 50 needy homes in the vicinity.

Last year a 17 yr old girl showed Judy all 17 photos taken with Santa in Arcanum, she'll be there this year too.

Santa's special helpers look forward to the weeks leading up to Christmas when they can be a part of making Christmas a special time in Arcanum, for the children and families in need.

Fire Bell Rings One Last Time

Daily Advocate - Saturday, March 31, 2007 - "The fire bell rang for the final time in the city building's bell tower at 10:40 a.m. on March 18. Arcanum Assistant Fire Chief Bill Oler rang the fire bell 7 times before a crane lifted the 710 pound bell safely to ground."

Have you noticed the bell which hangs from a brick saddle outside the fire house? After 5 years in storage the fire bell has a new home, an appropriate spot where residents can see and appreciate a part of Arcanum's history. The restoration of the bell was a costly project. Thanks to the Fire Department for preserving this part of our village's past.

The original warranty for the bell was discovered carefully preserved in a book of council minutes. Records show the bell was cast at Buckeye Bell Foundry in Cincinnati, Ohio, and was purchased from Vanduzen and Tift Company in 1891. Through research it was discovered the bell is either brass, bronze or a combination of the two and not cast iron.

Although the bell hung in the south bell tower of the Town/Township Hall until removal in 2007 it was not used to alert residents of a fire after electricity came to Arcanum.
