- (4) Did you know a Revolutionary War Solider is buried near Ithaca? Do you know the interesting story of his marker?
- (5) Where is the speculated location of the first settlers in southern Darke County?

Drive our tour and find out these answers plus about the mill outside of Ithaca and where the toll house was between Darke and Preble County.

### Self Guided Driving Tour of Southern Darke County

Arcanum Wayne Trail Historical Society has planned a self guided scenic drive through southern Darke County focusing on the Ithaca area. Annette Stewart and Bill Gunder planned the tour highlighting points of interest giving a glimpse of times long ago. Included here is more information about the area.

**Ithaca** was the first settlement to prosper in Twin Township serving as a trading center for what is now southern Darke County. When platted in 1832 by John Colville Ithaca was known as Twinsborough taking its name from Twin Creek. State Route 503 was known as Ithaca Pike, before that it was a trace used by Gen. Anthony Wayne marching north from Ft. Washington (Cincinnati) through Ithaca, Beech Grove to Ft. Jefferson and on to Greenville.

In the busiest days Ithaca provided everything residents of a small village needed, finding a place to hitch up a buggy on Saturday was difficult. The electric traction line going from Cincinnati to Union City stopped in Ithaca giving residents a quicker way to travel for visits and business. As with most small villages the direction of their future changed when railroads bypassed them.

The yellow building located on the end of East Cross Street is part of local history having been a grocery store in the early years up until recently and had also been the post office.

\* **Beech** Grove This settlement located at the intersection of Arcanum Hollanbsurg and Ithaca Pike was named due to the large number of beech trees growing in the area. John and Harry Karn owned properties from Arcanum Hollansburg Rd north to Neave Township. There was a large number of family members living in this section. The Atlas of Darke County 1875-1888 shows the cemetery, church, first school (each established in the mid 1850s) and store as well as several residences located on their properties.

"Beech Grove is the title of a new post office just established at the residence of John F. Roser, Esq. in Butler Township, Roser is P.M. This office was much needed; and we hope our friends through the region will now avail themselves of the opportunity to have a county paper sent to them free of postage." (Greenville Telegraphy, Wednesday, Feb. 18, 1852. This is the John F. Roser-Rosser, who later lived in Arcanum and died in the Civil War.

"David F. Dubbs who has resided south of Beech Grove for many years where he has been engaged in the manufacture of brick, and tile (and crockery) has quit business and left Sunday for Kinderport, Mo where he will make his home. (Arcanum times Oct. 14, 1909)

"Beech Grove Service Station, owned and operated by R. L. Homes is now open for business--they built a modern filling station and carry the usual line of gasoline, motor oils, groceries, candy, cigars and tobacco." (Arcanum Times Aug. 18, 1932) Located on a small section of the southeast corner near a current resdience.

The legend of the corner house, 5007 Arcanum Hollansburger Rd., has been passed on to each owner. The house dates back to the early days of Beech Grove when Rt. 503 was a busy pike used by the military, settlers moving north and families going to Greenville, the county seat. It's reported to have been a stage coach stop and served as a place for a wake for a couple soldiers killed in the area.

The 1875-1888 Atlas does not show a plat map of Beech Grove.

**Stagecoach Stop** The owners of the house at 630 N Main St. in Ithaca share the history of the house having been passed from home owner to home owner. It is known the northern section of the present home is built of log. The story told is that the house had been a stagecoach stop. In "History of Darke County " Mrs. Barney Collins recalled the following; "that was in the days when Hen Wikle drove stage (hack) from Lewisburgh and Euphema to Greenville twice a week. Several Greenville girls attended that college-among them my sister Lucinda- and these girls always rode to and from college in Wikle's hack".

The college mentioned by Mrs. Collins could well have been the Lewis Institute in Euphemia on Rt. 503 a short distance north of Rt. 40. The structure used by the Lewis Institute was last used as an apartment building, it was razed a few years ago following a fire. Many wanting to continue their education following 8th grade attended here as did George W. and Daniel Gunder, sons of William Gunder.

It is reasonable that Mr. Wikle would stop in Ithaca and Beech Grove to pick up or leave off travelers going to or from Lewisburgh and Greenville.

\* <u>Toll Gate House</u> "No turnpikes were built before a railway was constructed in the county. Ithaca Free Turnpike Road was granted on petition in June 1858." Questions presented here are where did this "turnpike" start (at the Preble/Darke County line?) and where did it end (Rt. 121/Wayne Lakes?) and how was the turnpike funded? "Of course the burden of taxation is heavy and not every farmer is in condition to pay \$4 an acre road tax. Some were obliged to sell off the land to enable them to meet assessments, but hard as it was, even such gained in the end by the rise in local values".

#### Self Guided Driving Tour continues

Some property owners resorted to putting up a toll gate to cover some of the cost needed to pay the taxes and also to cover the cost of maintaining the road. Toll gates could have been on main roads which were not yet deemed a turnpike and also on "feeder" roads or side roads which crossed their land leading to the turnpike.

It is known that a toll gate stood in Preble County at the cross roads of Rt. 503 and Darke Co. Preble Co. Line Rd. \* <u>Earliest Settlement</u> As stated in the book "The Secret Town - The Story of the Founding of Arcanum, Ohio" by William Gunder, great grandson of the Arcanum's founder, the speculated location of the earliest settlement in Twin Township was south of Ithaca along Twin Creek near Darke County Preble County Line Rd. These early pioneers located here about 1815 because it was near the trail coming from the south, for the good water source and flat land protected by higher ground. Carolina, the sister William Gunder and her family were part of this settlement. Often threaten by Indians the pioneers returned to Lewisburg in Preble County only to come back to Twin Township to establish their homesteads. *Reference: "History of Darke County Ohio, From Its Earliest Settlement to The Present Time", Vol. I by Frazer E. Wilson published in 1914.* 

#### Lloyd Hunt Inducted Into Military Hall Of Fame

Lloyd Hunt from Arcanum, Ohio will be inducted in the Military Hall of Fame on Friday April 24, 2015 in the State House Atrium in Columbus, Ohio. There will be 29 inductees that day and will commence at 11:30 am. The ceremony will be televised and is open to the public. Lloyd Hunt enlisted in the U.S. Army February 26,1941 as a Private First Class and rose to the rank of T/SGT at the time of his commendation for the Silver Star, May of 1944. Brig. General Arthur Rogers presented his award on July 28,1944. Lloyd also received the Bronze Star, Purple Heart, Combat Infantry Badge, EAME ribbon with 5 battle stars, American Defense Service Medal, American Campaign Medal WWII Victory Medal.

Lloyd's mother died February of 1942 while he was in Fort Lewis Washington. His comrades took up a collection for a train fare so he could go home for her funeral. His brothers Duane Hunt, Leo Hunt, Milford Hunt and twin Boyd Hunt also served in the war. All should be commended for their service during the war. If it were not for my father and his brothers and thousands of other men and women who so bravely fight for our freedom we wouldn't have what we have today.

Hopefully, we won't lose those freedoms. God bless America.
