SOUTHERN DARKE COUNTY HISTORY ANNETTE STEWART, Reference Library Coordinator 692-6462 **UPDATES**

The AWTHS has recognized the designated historic buildings and sites in Arcanum with bronze markers. Those serving on the Historic Committee were Keith Furlong and Fred Troutwine and the late Bill Gunder. Dave Flora helped with the installation. Numerous newspaper articles and social media sites portrayed the stories and photos of these legends. Sites publicized were: Ivester House (Arcanum Public Library), California House Hotel (private residence), Flat Iron (Rose Post), Louis Dietrich Saloon (AWTHS), John Smith Co. General Store (Smiths Merchants and The Old Arcana), site of the William Gunder Home, Founder of Arcanum (late Bill Gunder's home) and William Gunder's gravesite at Ithaca, the Founder. Self-Guided walking tour maps are available at the historical society. History of these sites can be found in the book "Arcanum, Ohio Business History (1852 thru 1968) by Anita Short. The book can be purchased. Favorable comments were made regarding the history and the knowledge gained by the community.

Fred Troutwine, tour host, led the Versailles Historical Society through the historic section of Arcanum. He also explained the history of our organization and the building history in October for around 9 guests. Tour sites included the Arcanum Public Library (Ivester Home) and The Arcana as well as the Founder's Home. The group stopped at Brumbaugh's Fruit Farm and Bear's Mill plus our local All American Clothing Store.

Nancy Baker will be working on typing up church history. If you would like to research or write but aren't computer savory or a great typist, Nancy has again graciously volunteered to type up your information. Thanks to Nancy we also have Kreitzer's Funeral Records in digital form to look up funeral and death records from 1950 to the present. These records are available to view by appointment only.

Keith Furlong and Lynn Trump put together some book cases in our upstairs library storage room. These will hold recently acquired binders and photos to help us organize our storage area and system. Thank you!

NEW FAMILY HISTORY DONATIONS

Bruce Shank recently donated his Shank family history. Names include: Ancestor Frederick Shank, Goodner, Ditmer, Rynearson, McDaniel and Yount.

A map and directions are included to tour the area sites of the Shank family. His family goes back to the Revolutionary War soldier Frederick Shank. His old log cabin is still on the property on Grubbs Rex Road near Little Road on the south side of the road and is a private residence today. His son Philip Shank and Rosanna Yount Shank also lived here. Ahijah Shank and Eliza Rynearson Shank lived where Tom Jackson owns the farm today back the long L shaped lane at the end of Albright Road off of Grubbs Rex Road. Photos and a large family tree are also part of the collection.

I have donated my own family history to the library on these families which many were and are local families: Brumbaugh, Culbertson, Fourman, Hofacker, Michael, and Sease. The Fourman's, Hofackers, Sease and Michael's were early settlers to this area. This is a collection of family history and photos from both sides of the family and includes a chapter on our farm homestead and who has lived on our farm. This was a birthday present to my mother, Betty Brumbaugh Sease.

HOW DO I ORGANIZE FAMILY RECORDS? WHERE CAN I GET THAT INFORMATION? WHAT IS THAT RECORD?

These are some questions I'm frequently asked. Many want to start their family history and genealogy or organize their family's collections but do not know where to start. Others have good intentions but never get around to it. Others don't know about research tips or where to find documents or how to use them. With those thoughts in mind, I'm writing a mini-series to help you get started. After the Christmas decorations are put away and it's a chilly winter day you'll have plenty of time.

- 1. <u>First gather what records and information you probably already have</u> in your home or your parents/grandparents' home such as birth/death/marriage certificates or records. Look for a funeral program, cut out clipping of announcement or obit. You may have a diary, journal, or scrapbook with photos and memorabilia. Other records might be land deeds or wills especially if you have administered an estate yourself for someone. Most have plat maps. These are good sources to start with.
- 2. <u>Use a Family Group Sheet or Tree paperwork</u> to get you started or install a computer genealogy program. Bill Gunder used "Legacy" but shop around and see what is available for your needs. We have Family Group Sheets at the AWTHS or the form can be downloaded from our website. Group the same family record together in a folder or binder. If records aren't organized in some manner you may become confused and frustrated and end up abandoning the project.

- 3. <u>Look carefully at each document or collection</u>. For instance, start with your own name and family. On the form you would list your name, Date of Birth, Marriage Date, Husband's Name and info on spouse as well as Children's Names and their Spouses. Also listed is the next generation which would be completed on each Married Child. Also work backward listing Your Parents Name which will give you the next generation back to complete. You should have several last names to work with by including the Maiden Names.
- 4. <u>List this information on the forms</u>. Make a note of Missing dates or names. This is info you may need to ask your parents or go to the courthouse and get the document or record. Some records are available on-line. Be careful if not an actual document and just a family tree.
- 5. Marriages, Death, Birth certificates are available for Darke County Residents at the Health Department in Greenville (By the Greenville Park) as well as wills and estate paperwork.
- 6. Land Deeds, Tax Records are at the Courthouse downtown Greenville.
- 7. Some records are available through AWTHS website: www.arcanumhistoricalsociety.org. Search the "Reference List". Arcanum paper obits are available on here as well under the "Public Records" section tab.
- 8. Newspapers are another source. We have some of the Greenville newspapers on digital files through AWTHS. Other places to search are Arcanum and Greenville Library and Garst Genealogy and Research Room. If out of the county or state check their libraries and historical societies. Eventually we will have all the Arcanum Times in sleeves and binders available to read.
- 9. Other sources include: Family Bibles and talking to other family members or relation. They may have family photos or a document such as letters that you do not have. I learned about family stories and traditions this way. Another source is the internet such as Roots Web where inquiries can be made as well as searching the archive files for your ancestor. With social media the opportunities are endless for searching and joining groups of similar interest and names.

Next time we will go into detail with the different types of records and documents. Until then get your collection and forms together. Once completed AWTHS would like a copy of your family history or tree for our collection.

INVITATION

I would like to extend an invitation to you to learn more about these books and records by coming in on "First Saturday's" at AWTHS. We can actually show you what a census book is or cemetery readings and how to use them in your search. Susie Weisenbarger is assisting with our AWTHS library and learning as well as helping with our materials. We would ask that you bring the following with you (1) a list or the forms/materials of what you have recorded and found. (2) A list with your questions and what you are looking for such as DOB/DOD or names. If you can narrow the date down to a time period or location to a more specific area that is helpful to make the research process productive for all. And I recommend looking over the research list and surname list from the website prior; this way you will know what we have available and from what time frames and so forth.

NEEDS

Readers to look for "school" notes in the typed notes from Anita Short from the newspapers. This info is needed for an upcoming old school house program.

Also any stories or photos you have about the one room old school houses especially in Twin, Butler, or Van Buren Township. <u>This is a priority need</u> as well as searching for information in township or school minute books to be used for upcoming program.

A volunteer to transfer video programs to laptop and to create DVD's.

Writers and Researchers and those willing to look up questions.

Volunteers and Trainees to actively participate in helping with the Reference Library.

Anita Short's Cemetery Inscription Book 3 which list Abbottsville Cemetery records or any Abbottsville Cemetery records prior to 1923.
