Education - Third Graders Visit AWTHS

2017 Old Fashioned Days Parade Float

Presidents, past and current, represented AWTHS this year on the Old Fashioned Days parade float.

We want to give Richard a big thank you for all the years he volunteered to pull our float with either the pickup truck or his restored 1948 Ford 8N tractor. AWTHS DESIGNATES HISTORIC SITES

Center School, circa. 1884 and Arcanum School, circa 1876 have been added to the list of historic sites.

<u>Center School</u> - Located on the Thomas Jackson farm at 6891 Grubbs-Rex Road, east of Arcanum-Ithaca road, Center School was built in 1884. Records show that a school stood near these grounds as early as 1839.

The one room school will be the site of an open house and program Sept. 10th.

<u>"Old" Arcanum School</u> - Located at 110 East South Street the two storied school was constructed in 1876. Housing all grades through high school, after 48 years student enrollment outgrew this space. A new school was built in 1924 at 310 N. Main Street on land purchased from Mattie Ivester.

Delisle School, corner of Delisle-Fourman and Myers-Tillman Roads
