Post Office Standing Desk and Mail Sorting Box



Faith United Methodist Church Pulpit



The first Arcanum U.S. Post office dating back to 1853 was housed on the second floor of the John Smith Co. at 109 W. George St.

The historical society is pleased to have the post master's standing desk and also one section of the original mail sorting boxes. The mail sorting box still has labels attached indicating destinations: states, cities and territories.

The mail sorting box is on loan from Jim Hill, great great grandson of John Smith.

The desk was donated by Bob Menker. Bob purchased sections of the post office when the contents of the John Smith Co. general store were auctioned in 1995.

An ornate antique pulpit has been acquired from Faith United Methodist Church in May, 2017.

Located at 101 East South St., Arcanum this church's beginnings started in a log meeting house built two miles east of Arcanum on the North side of Painter Creek, just north of alternate 49 East. In 1856, it became the United Brethren in Christ. The church relocated into Arcanum at an old school house which was eventually torn down and a new church was built at its current location. The dedication was held in 1897.

In November 1946, the nationwide United Brethren Church joined with the Evangelical Association and the church became the Evangelical United Brethren Church. Again another merger -- this in 1968. The Evangelical United Brethren and Methodists merged to become the United Methodist Church.

The pulpit is shown in a photo of the sanctuary dated 1898.
