# Preserving The History Of Arcanum And Surrounding Area Through The Memories You Share

As with many of our programs presented to our members and the community we rely on your memories, photos and memorabilia to tell the whole story – the best we know it.

#### June 11 10:00 a.m. Donne Hayden

Donne Hayden discusses Preble County Quaker and Darke County families helping runaway slaves through the underground railroad.

While attending Earlham School of Religion, a Quaker seminary, Donne Hayden began research for her book, *A Sense of the Meeting: A History of Elk Monthly Meeting, 1805-2005* which was published in 2005 in time for the West Elkton Friends Meeting's 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Over the next 15 years, she continued research and revision of the book and in 2020, self-published a revised, expanded version.

The program at Arcanum Wayne Trail Historical Society will give Donne an opportunity to talk about materials collected in her research for *A Sense of the Meeting* which didn't make it into that book.

Specifically, she will address abolitionist / antislavery activities and relationships of Quakers and free black communities in Darke County, Ohio and Randolph County, Indiana (Cabin Creek, Snow Hill, Greenville, and the fully-integrated union Literary Institute).

Through Donne's presentation we will be able to have more of an understanding of those earlier days when these communities offered a safe place to live in harmony.
