<u>AWTHS 2004-2024</u> * <u>A Look Back 20 Years</u>

After purchasing the Arcanum Wayne Trail Grange #2647 building work began to restore the 1894 structure and the lawn took on a different look also.

2006 Iron fencing along the new north flower bed was donated by Mike and Connie Payne. The fence was originally on the property of the old Arcanum School located on East South Street.

2006 A huge urn along with two small wrought iron chairs and table were added to the west lawn.

2006 Veterans Memorial Park adjacent AWTHS was acquired from Arcanum Area Business Association.

2007 Arcanum Garden Club made a generous donation enabling AWTHS to plant a Bay Magnolia tree in the east corner of the north flower bed. Also as part of the club's gift a white distressed iron bench with two matching flower stands was placed on the west lawn.

2009 A commemorative walk recognizing individuals was laid in front of the Veterans Park with bricks purchased by area residents.

2011 Boy Scout Jake Armstrong built a shed for AWTHS as his Eagle Scout project. For the past few years Arcanum High School students have helped mulch the flower beds as part of the school's **Serve Arcanum** community project. We appreciate the students' help and also all the donations to AWTHS.

The research library has been busy answering inquiries, writing blogs, formatting Facebook post and trying to keep things and collections organized in the library. Our last host, Chase Osterday, was hosting when Garth Stephens brought in a collection of photos and memorabilia from the Stephens Sawmill. The photos are from the 1978 blizzard as well as information on the wood cut for the restoration of the Constitution Ship. Check out our March 3 FB post to view.

Recent acquisitions included some old newspapers originally from Mollie Hansbarger. They were found by the Clark's in the attic of the house they were remodeling in an old doctor's bag. From the newspapers, we found articles and information on business people of Arcanum. Some contained their photos. We acquired several which were not in the AWTHS archives. Those included: Zach Baker who I found out later was Denise Hansbarger's great grandfather. Another is Fourman's Sawmill (later Stephens Sawmill), Lampe & Brawley Hardware, Abe Bloom, Harry Hoffman, Zimmerman's Restaurant and Bakery, and Hole Poultry.

<u>These articles on businesses were found in the old 1900's newspaper</u> from Mollie Hansbarger's home along with the "Arcanum Business" book by Anita Short.

101 West George Street - Corner of George and High

1880 Duffee Grocery, Arcanum Post Office, Kaylor Furniture Store and Fitzgerald Peanut & Cigar Stand.

Per the Greenville Journal in 1889 a fire broke out and there was damage. However the walls of the building were saved and the building renovated. There was a number of businesses established here including Fred Harris Hardware and Brown's Service Store.

Sometime after 1969 the building was torn down and the Drive Thru branch of the Arcanum National Bank was built. Today it is D&D Beauty and Skin, LLC.

17 North High Street

H. C. Zimmerman operated a bakery and restaurant at 17 North High.

It's possible the bakery was in another location prior. Possibly the Kepler block or that could have been his father's grocery. Today 17 North High is a part of Millers. Previously Skaggs Tavern.

H C.'s father was C W Zimmerman. He had a home and grocery on the corner of East South and North Main (built around 1854) which was taken down in 1929 to build a gas station. Today it is Troutwine's car lot across from JoAnne Hill's home.

Abe Bloom Shoe Shop

This business was in numerous locations all over Arcanum, especially on George Street.

He was in the Clark's addition which is the current Cruizers Restaurant and Fourman's Variety location. The old Clark building was torn down late 1940's-early 1950 and poor Abe didn't have a place to go with his business.

Per the Arcanum Business book you can follow his moves but a few locations included the old Arcanum Times newspaper building (aka Early Bird), the old L. H. Smith Building 19 W George, the bank building. (aka today around STF Insurance - fitness place)

AWTHS 20th Anniversary 2004-2024 Arcanum Wayne Trail Historical Society – First 10 Years

This article first appeared in the April 2014 AWTHS newsletter.

Through the dedication and hard work of many people in our area the Arcanum Wayne Trail Historical Society has become a prominent part of Arcanum and Southern Darke County.

Founded in 2004 by citizens whose heritage goes back to the early days: Bill Gunder, Dave and Jo Anne Pleasant (Smith) Hill, Keith and Carolyn Patterson Furlong, Fred and Carolyn Troutwine, John and Holly Trigg, and Anita Bowers Short.

In the early years trees were so dense squirrels could jump from one tree to another. A time when people walked on plank sidewalks from store to store to avoid the swampy ground. A time when two train tracks intersected in town bringing new people to settle here and to work the fertile ground. The trains then took the products of their hard labor to markets: tobacco, lumber, and grains.

Hard work which was ingrained in the early settlers is the same fortitude which inspired AWTHS members to take on the project of bringing life back into the 1894 structure first built to house the Louis Dietrich Hotel and Saloon. Many who volunteered, who labored many hours, those who gave supplies and funds, and those who donated for and worked at many fundraisers remember the building as the Beck Hotel, later Wayne Trail Grange No. 2647.

A walk through the house is a walk into the past. Woodwork was striped of paint and renewed. Some floors were refinished. Walls stripped of faded wallpaper, then patched and painted. Panels in the meeting room were removed to reveal the 12 foot ceiling with high windows which had been hidden for many years. Window treatments were made from drapes long forgotten by previous owners. Chandeliers and light fixtures which once hung in many older Arcanum homes now shine on hundreds of items members and residents have generously given to be preserved, items that help tell the history of Arcanum and Southern Darke County.

Our talented members worked diligently to craft spindles, woodwork & trim, to build much needed display and storage pieces, and much more. Beautiful stained glass pieces were made to fit in the transoms.

New exterior doors were selected to keep with the period of the house and still meet code requirements. To preserve the exterior, bricks were cleaned, sealed and tuck pointed. Bricks, limestone lintels and sills were replaced where needed. The roof, soffits, gutters, down spouts, furnace, and water heater are all new. The first floor is now air conditioned. Windows were replaced. And those are only the major projects completed.

The Dietrich Hotel, Beck Hotel, and Wayne Trail Grange each hold a place in the history of Arcanum. The Arcanum Wayne Trail Historical Society is bringing that history and the history of Southern Darke County together. The mission of AWTHS is: "to collect, preserve and foster an appreciation for our past and promote an interest and knowledge of past historical events for citizens of all ages, which may act as a foundation for future generations and instill a sense of pride in local history."

To accomplish the purpose of AWTHS, "collecting and preserving of records, artifacts, memorabilia, materials, and genealogical research pertaining to the history of the Arcanum area". A reference and genealogy library has been well established. Around 4000 photos of the community, family histories, books, school yearbooks and over 35 binders on all types of subjects in Arcanum as well as Pitsburg and Southern Darke County are available for research and casual reading. Digital files are also available as well as actual Arcanum Times Newspapers. Books documenting Arcanum's history: the founding and founder's family, businesses, life in the community, the fire department, Ivestor House and Arcanum Public Library are available for purchase.

Several structures have been identified as historical sites. The monuments for the founder of Arcanum, William and Nance Rice Gunder, in the Ithaca Cemetery have been restored. These projects also meet the purpose of the society: "identify and marking buildings and locations of historical significance as well as preserving skills and building techniques shall be considered part of the purpose of the society".

The lot adjacent AWTHS, where the D&U station was located, is now Veterans Memorial Park and is the property of the historical society. The park is used for the farmers market and also for community activities.

AWTHS presents educational programs for school children and the public, and holds special activities such as Darke County Center for the Arts concerts.

Through membership dues, generous donations, grants and fundraisers AWTHS has generated \$207,670 in the first 10 years, making it possible to remain viable. All who have been part of the AWTHS board these past 10 years appreciate the many, many who have made this possible.
